Nancy Isenberg offers an intriguing analysis of how politics shaped Aaron Burr's public career in the 18th century—and how they are shaping his reputation today. Isenberg will also address the influence of the Enlightenment on Burr's thinking.

Dr. Isenberg is a Professor of History at the University of Tulsa and the author of the new, acclaimed biography *Fallen Founder: The Life of Aaron Burr*.
